

Research Groups

Research groups are a good example for Knowledge building communities who share a common goal of building meaningful knowledge representations through activities, projects and discussion and the tutor is an active, learning participant in the community. A common goal of knowledge building communities is to advance and share the knowledge of the collective.

Process

- Faculty members start by creating research groups within their program.
- Such groups are composed of volunteered students (preferred who possess good level in English and good writing skills).
- Every group is led by one Faculty member or more as mentor(s).
- The aim of the groups is to develop the students' ability to read, criticize, and write a research paper.
- Students' produced work within groups including (completed research papers, papers in progress, projects, and ideas) will be presented in research events.
- Different groups can work on applying for research projects fund from the TRC or similar organizations.
